IGO is an ASX listed mining and exploration company, founded in 2000 and based in Perth (Western Australia).

Exploration activity

IGO is dedicated to supporting the transition to clean energy. We explore for key metals like lithium, copper and nickel – essential for technologies such as electric vehicles and renewable energy storage.

Greenbushes is host to one of the world's premier lithium deposits, which is why IGO and other companies are undertaking further nearby exploration.

Exploration involves several stages. It commences with minimal disturbance activities such as aerial surveys, mapping and soil sampling, and may then progress to drilling if the initial results are promising. The early stages help determine whether an area has mineral potential or should be ruled out for future exploration.

At every stage we carefully assess the impact and viability of continuing.

As a company committed to responsible environmental, social, and governance (ESG) practices, IGO ensures that exploration is done respectfully, safely, and transparently.

To date, IGO's activity in the Bridgetown-Greenbushes area has been limited to minimal disturbance activities including mapping, rock chip sampling, stream sediment and soil sampling, and geophysics (gravity).

Current phase

IGO has several exploration licenses in the Bridgetown-Greenbushes area. These tenements include areas of private landownership as well as State Forest.

For the former, IGO representatives meet with the landowners to negotiate access to their properties and discuss the proposed early-stage exploration.

For the latter, work within areas of State Forest is strictly governed by an approved Conservation Management Plan (CMP) developed in consultation with the Department of Biodiversity Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) and the Department of Mines, Petroleum and Exploration (DMPE). The CMP places constraints on how and where exploration activities can take place in order to ensure the environmental, cultural and heritage significance of the land is protected and includes monitoring.

IGO will be undertaking further minimal disturbance exploration activities on the Bridgetown-Greenbushes tenements over the 2025-2026 summer, commencing in January 2026.

These are early-stage exploration activities (mapping and soil sampling) that involve minimal ground disturbance beyond access (typically by foot from the nearest road), use non-mechanical or handheld equipment, and have no significant impact on the environment.
